#### Educational responsibilities

I'm actively involved locally, regionally, nationally plus internationally. I am a clinical and educational supervisor and strongly believe in education of the next generation of consultants with development of their non-technical skills to produce a competent and holistically trained surgeon.

I supervise medical student SSM's and the most recent student won the audit prize for Secondary Prevention of Osteoporosis following fracture at an Undergraduate Surgical Conference. I am currently clinical supervisor to a UCL PhD student who is working within our department on a Health Informatics project. I also support two Bradford Institute of Health Research Patient Safety Fellows as part of the Hand Surgery Users Working Group.

Regionally within specialty training I have organised and chaired regional teaching sessions at BRI plus small group pre-exam hand sessions. I write the annual regional mock FRCS T&O MCQ exam which has been adopted within our review criteria for ARCP and used as appraisal for readiness to sit the FRCS T&O exit exam. This year I have organised a 4 day FRCS T&O Clinical Revision Course at BRI (3 days of lectures with a final day viva and clinical FRCS T&O part 2 exam). This will be repeated for at least the next three years.

I was elected Member of the Faculty of Surgical Trainers at the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and completed the Health Education England and General Medical Council Educational Supervisors Training in the first wave.

## **Essence of Surgical Practice**

I am a substantative Orthopaedic Surgical Consultant with a subspecialist interest in surgery of the Hand & Wrist plus Elbow (90:10 mix). I take part in the Orthoplastic Hand rota for a tertiary hand unit serving 1 million patients. I have attained the European Diploma in Hand Surgery (EurDipHandSurg) qualification, awarded by the Federation of European Societies for Surgery of the Hand (FESSH).

I have specialist interest in hand, carpus and wrist injury with early aggressive treatment of bony and soft tissue injuries by open reduction and internal fixation and/ or arthroscopy followed by mobilisation. I am part of a Multidisciplinary Team of Orthopaedic and Plastic Hand Surgeons, Therapist and Specialist Nurses. I perform the vast majority of the complex forearm, carpal and wrist trauma in addition to flexor tendon repair, microsurgical digital and peripheral nerve repair and grafting, finger tip reconstruction, local hand skin flaps and grafting, hand and digit fracture fixation and I also feel confident managing complex elbow, humeral and clavicular fractures.

In elective surgery I am confident in non-surgical and surgical management of common hand, wrist, elbow and shoulder problems. I have the ability to perform most operations within the hand and wrist including dupuytens surgery; trapezieometacarpal, interphalengeal and metacarpophalengeal arthroplasty; wrist fusion, arthroscopic wrist surgery and correctional distal radial osteotomies; consequences of wrist/carpal trauma and its reconstruction.

Further interests include ambulatory local anaesthetic and block surgery, treatment of basal thumb arthritis, redesign of patient referral guidelines and pathways for acute and elective patients, design and introduction of hand trauma database and education of junior Plastic and Orthopaedic Surgeons and allied Health Professionals.

## **Subspecilaist Fellowship Training**

## Interface Orthoplastic Fellow in Hand Surgery,

Wythenshawe Hospital, Hope Hospital & Wrightington Hospitals (January – December 2009) Within this fellowship there was a high volume of work going through the three units, I had the fantastic opportunity to perform and assist at a wide variety of hand surgery covering virtually all areas of the Orthoplastic spectrum. I am comfortable operating in loupes and have become more competent with operative microscope use and microsurgical repair and grafting of nerves. I have had specialist clinic experience in Paediatric Hands, Peripheral Nerve and Plexus Injury, Upper Limb Prosthetics and Complex Wrist Injury. I performed approximately 500 operative cases.

#### Upper Limb and Hand Surgery Fellow,

## Royal Derby Hospital & The Pulvertaft Hand Centre (January – August 2010)

Within this fellowship I am consolidated my skills in Upper Limb and Hand Surgery concentration on arthroscopic procedures and replacement of the shoulder and elbow and treatment of complex trauma of the upper limb and hand. My training timetable consists of time spent between the Orthopaedic Department and the Pulvertaft Hand Unit with independent parallel theatre sessions.

## Orthopaedic & Trauma Surgery Experience

I qualified in 1996 and since 2000 I have been practising solely in Orthopaedics and Trauma Surgery. My experience includes six months as a Junior House Officer, one year as a Senior House Officer, two years as an Experienced SHO/ Trust Registrar and six years as a Specialist Registrar on the Yorkshire training programme. Details of the specific hospitals I have worked in both during my basic surgical training and higher surgical training can be found in the **appendix (i)**.

## **Management and Leadership Skills**

## Developing a high quality service

The improvements made in the service redesign are evolving and must move to provide the BSSH designated highest level hand surgery service with an integrated Orthoplastic Hand Surgery Unit.

We have set up a Hand Surgery Unit Working Group supporting two BIHR/NIHR Patient Safety Fellows to explore the need, design and implementation of this.

I am currently reviewing previously developed evidence based protocols/ treatment guidelines including: Scaphoid injury CT investigation & staging plus treatment; fingertip/ nail bed injury; Digital fractures; Metacarpal fracture & Tendon injury. Further modification is in progress on referral guidelines (working locally with CCG for elective and local/regional trusts for trauma); and to improve the patient journey through altered work patterns which will facilitate increased LA/ Regional anaesthesia for trauma cases on daily consultant delivered 'cold planned' trauma lists; and one-stop follow up with expert nurses and therapists.

We are looking to develop a hub and spoke rehab service which combined with improved data capture and coding will ensure we are being paid at the most appropriate tertiary care tariff. The development of this service has only been possible through improved staff education.

Ultimately we should evolve to a tertiary ambulatory daycase hand unit.

## Delivering a high quality service

I have led redesign of the hand surgery service to include peer-reviewed MDT ward rounds and the development of improved history documentation, hand surgery assessment and referral pathways for BRI and surrounding Trusts.

I have implemented a hand injury database which has enhanced safer logging, handover, booking and follow up of patients. The database facilitates audit of our service for comparison against BSSH standards.

I have developed our post-op care improving access to rehab with increased staff, hand rehab referral pathways and development of a nurse led dressing clinic with specialist hand therapist input. As a result of the redesign we have improved efficiency through reduced trauma and elective cancellations and reduced costs.

Purchase of two mini c-arm fluroscans for hand theatres has enabled us to operate without the need for a radiographer. In addition, rationalisation of equipment required and amalgamation of theatre trays has reduced sterilisation costs. I managed the Hand equipment tender which led to a £5000 pa saving on implants and further reduction in the need for loan kit.

As a result of this modernisation, patient safety has improved through improved documentation, communication and education of staff.

## **Previous Experience**

During my SpR training I was the Specialist Registrar representative on the Regional Orthopaedic Training Specialist Committee and have been a Yorkshire Deanery Trainee Representative for assessment of the Yorkshire Super Deanery by PMETB. I was the Regional British Orthopaedic Trainees Association Linkman.

During my time as a Trust Registrar I was the Chair of the South West Scotland and Dumfries & Galloway Royal Infirmary Junior Doctors Committees and also sat on the BMA Scottish Junior Doctors Committee. I have been involved in negotiations with personnel and management regarding banding, working patterns, catering, accommodation and education/ funding. I was a trained representative for the BMA.

I have sat on a Local Negotiating Committee, Local Implementation Groups and Medical Staffing Committees during various Specialist Registrar and Experienced SHO posts. During Basic Surgical Training I sat on the Junior Doctors Forum at the Western Infirmary. I was involved in the development of Integrated Care Pathways for fractured neck of femur and lower limb total joint arthroplasty in Dumfries, having already sat on a similar working group in Dorset County Hospital.

Throughout my training and Consultant post I have actively participated in clinical governance in all its forms so that I can provide high quality care to my patients at all times and ensure patient safety is paramount. Some evidence of clinical governance is shown below.
